It is finished

John 19:30 records the last words spoken by Jesus on the cross. With three simple words, He ended centuries of labor. With three simple words, He removed the requirement of labor forever. Have you ever considered that? It is a really interesting thought.

You see in the Old Testament God set up a system of justice. In this system of justice

there was a law, and breaking the law had consequences. In order to be fair, if you will, God then set up a system where His people would have to do specific things if they wanted their lawlessness, or times of breaking the law, to be forgiven. Sounds familiar right? Breaking God's law is sin. The penalty for sin is death. However, by God's grace, He set up the sacrificial system so that man could make temporary atonement for sin by means of sacrifice. Now certain sins required certain sacrifices, and there was no real one size fits all sacrifice to cover all sins. This made the sacrificial system very tiring. It was a real labor to make sure that your sins were covered. This went on for thousands of years! Man sinned, man sacrificed, sin was covered temporarily, man sinned again, no longer covered, repeat process.

This all changed with three simple words. IT IS FINISHED! The words Jesus spoke on the cross were the ending of all that labor! No longer would man have to sacrifice, because the greatest sacrifice ever had occurred! No longer would man have to labor, ensuring that his family was covered by the atonement blood; because the greatest atonement blood had just been shed. See Jesus IS the Lamb of God! He IS the greatest sacrifice that ever could happen, and HE came for you, in obedience to the Father, our of the LOVE of God, one and for all! This means that when you place your faith in Jesus, you are washed by the blood of Jesus. You don't have to

worry about sacrificing and laboring, because HE did all that for you. You could never do enough! You see God loves you so much that He came, He labored, He suffered, He bled, He bore your strips, He took your nails, He took your place on the cross, all because God loves you that much!

No one has greater love than this, that someone would lay down his life for his friends (John 15:13). Jesus is calling out to you this simple message. He loves you. He died for you. Stop carrying the burdens of your past! That labor is finished. If you are God's child, you are God's friend! And the best friend you could ever have has His hand out waiting to take away your burdens! It is finished! Trust those words!

Come join the fun at a birthday party April 17 at 2:45 p.m. at Pinehill Nursing


