Pastor's column

Anxious about being anxious

Sunday morning, March 21 found me on cloud nine. I was getting ready to preach the inspired word of God, and I knew I had the right sermon. Thirty six hours earlier I didn't have a clue what to preach. I had become anxious about what the sermon. After my dear friend Brenda texted me about the sermon title for the bulletin I had to confess

to her that I didn't have one and asked her to pray for me. Five minutes later I had a word from God -'Anxiety'.

The sermon went well, but while driving home after church I became anxious for someone dear to me and couldn't get control of my thoughts. This led to greater anxiety and a whole lot of similar worrying and fretting. Those three words with the basic same meaning will wear you out if you don't fight the good fight with the extra strength of the Lord. We can't win that battle on our own. So, I am going to go out on a really short limb and discern that maybe a few in my congregation have also dealt with being anxious about something since that sermon.

In the sermon I referred to the writings of the Apostle Paul. You know the full proof game plan for beating worry, anxiousness, and fretting as related by him in Philippians 4:6-8. In this scripture he instructs us to not be anxious about anything (just don't do it) and instead with thanksgiving to pray about everything while filling our minds with positive, praise worthy thoughts. But you and I and Paul are all alike. We each have a mind that is continually being attacked. Paul himself the master teacher kept stumbling over his burden for the welfare of the churches.

Paul endured a recurring battle in his mind to live a worry free life as much as possible. At least Paul's times of anxiousness led to his taking action instead of being spiritually and emotionally paralyzed like many Christians today.

The main point for this article is to stress to each of us that the battle has already been won on the cross and it is our job to appropriate that truth by never giving in to Satan's devilish scheme to distract us. Yes, the Apostle Paul gave us all the truth that we need to prevail, but the fact remains it is a battle and Paul can also attest to that truth. Some folk might think it a bit immature to cover the same topic twice in seven days, but when God says shed more light on the subject you shed more light on the subject. In fact I am in pretty good company because Paul told the believers in Philippi that it didn't bother him to repeat or reinforce the same message. *Finally, my fellow believers, continue to rejoice and delight in the LORD. To write the same things again is no trouble for me, and it is a safeguard for you.* (Philipians 3:1)

Did you hear that! Paul said that it was a safeguard to them. So rejoice that God loves us enough to keep bringing the good word of His grace until we get it right. He knows life can be tough, but He has all the ability and strength to see us through. We like Paul look forward to hearing "well done my good and faithful servant". Until then, don't quit, and 'Just Don't Do It' when it comes to worrying, being anxious, and fretting. Have a blessed week and keep your eyes on Jesus who is the author and perfecter of your faith.
