A friendly reminder to start the year

But God proves his own love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Romans 5:8 CSB

A new year brings many opportunities along with new challenges and hardships. Anything can happen in a single year that changes our lives for the better or for the worse.

Through whatever life throws our way, we should not, and cannot forget who we are both with and without God. Hence the title of this article. Let's explore who we are without God first.

Andrew Klavan, an Edgar Award winning novelist and host of "The Andrew Klavan Show" was talking about how President George W. Bush used to say that what people want is to be free. Klavan said that he disagreed with the former president, saying that people want to be comfortable, using the Israelites rebelling against God as the reason why the former president is wrong. While Moses was on Mount Sinai receiving 613 commandments, including the Ten Commandments from God, the Israelites made a golden calf and called it a god in place of God the Father.

This raises an obvious question: why? Why did the Israelites feel the need to have a physical god to worship? Impatience and lack of faith are two reasons, but let us focus on another element of this story. God is not a physical being. And it is natural for humans to long for a physical figure of authority to look to for guidance and wisdom. Hence, the Israelites needed a physical god because they wanted the emotional attachment of a physical being. The golden calf was the solution to the problem of God supposedly abandoning them. Klavan is right when he says humans do not want to be free: they want to be comfortable. The Israelites were comfortable with a god they could see to make up for God, whom they could not see.

We cannot see God today. The Bible tells us that if we look at Him we will die. So, what are we like with God? What are we like when we have a relationship with Him? We are changed people. We are not like the Israelites in the sense that we don't know what God has given us. We know God is always with us. We know we can trust Him. And we have God's grace. Grace that saves us from the power sin has over our lives despite man's sinful nature. Now, because Christ died and rose for our sake, God has power over sin.

To be clear, I am not suggesting that humans today do not have a longing for physical things to "save" us, because we do, even when we are saved. That is a testament to the power of sin still in us believers. But, as I have already said, God can overcome the things that we lack. The God we worship is the same God who gave us life, talents and free will among other things. And we must live our lives like we know what we have through Him for as long as He allows us.
