Contentment. Being content. It is such a strange word, and yet it is a state that we would all like to be in. Defined it means being in a state of peaceful happiness, satisfied. or As Christians it means being satisfied with what God provides. This is something we should all strive to achieve, an attitude we should all obtain:

There is another word, one that has been engraved into my heart and mind over the past few weeks. One that is far more understandable, far more relatable, and, yes, easier to comprehend. Then in August we will look at what peace looks like. We will learn, using God's PERFECT Word, what God says about how we are to respond to life's trials. Most importantly, we are going to learn how to find PEACE in every aspect of our lives. Sound complicated? It's not. It's actually very simple, just hard; but hey, no one said winning a war was easy!


