Deepening my dependence

It is a Friday morning as I write this article. I am sitting at my desk with a book of sermons by Jonathan Edwards, opened to the first page. My coffee mug filled with delicious coffee from beans that I grinded myself is next to me and smelling so good. I am trying to catch up on my Spurgeon devotional that is on my cell phone (Spurgeon on my cell phone!). My mind is carried

away with thoughts of the members of our church family that are sick, or struggling with various conditions. The text we have covered in 1 John and in Hosea are weighing heavy upon my heart. Yet I am joyful and encouraged to the point that my office has become my place of worship. If you come to the church today and hear me singing I am sorry.

I am convinced however, that you would be singing and worshiping too if God were making something so amazingly clear to you as He is to me. Edwards, Spurgeon, 1 John, and Hosea are all screaming the same thing; "Be dependent on Christ!" 1 John has shown me that without Christ I would be a legalist that hates other people and loves the things of this world. Hosea has taught me that I am a harlot at the core of my very nature; dressed in rags; willing to give myself away to my lovers and then give my lovers credit for the blessings in my life. Yet God in His faithfulness loved me and allured me in such a way that I repented of my sins and became his bride.


In my Spurgeon reading from my phone (Spurgeon from my phone!), he said, "Moreover we may not refuse reliance upon God on the grounds of our insignificance; for it is not conceivable that anything can be too little for God."

Edwards said, "God is glorified in the work of redemption in this, that there appears in it so absolute and universal a dependence of the redeemed on him."

It is therefore my privilege to share this simple yet most important thought with you all. Live a life of risk, sacrifice, love, simplicity, joy, and freedom all for the glory of Christ. Lean upon Christ and Christ alone for all your strength, power, satisfaction, and significance. The cry of the Gospel is that God loved us while we were yet sinners. This means while we were small, puny, worthless and powerless; Jesus Christ died to save us. In our redemption the power and the strength of God were displayed in our weakness.

If we would give a big "amen" because we believe these things to be true then why would we want to live our redeemed life in our own power and might? Why not stay week and frail so that the power of The Savior can manifest itself so that the name of God will be made much of? Why be dependent on anything other than Christ? I would challenge you at this point to take a good long look within and examine yourself. How much to you rely on Christ?

Sarah-Averill Brannen claimed first place in the junior division of the TasteOff with a pound cake. She also had the best presentation.


Kylee West finished second in the junior division of the TasteOff with her clown cake.


