Pastor's column Just pray



Just pray. Think about those words. Just pray. Maybe it will help if I place an emphasis: *just* pray. So often I hear people say something to the effect of: I don't know what I can do to help, so I will *just* pray; or sometimes when on the phone asking if there is anything I can do, the response is *just* pray. Perhaps the words *just* pray really mean: I could really use your prayers. But I fear that what it really means is something far less than understanding of the reality of the word PRAY. We often treat prayer as an after thought, or as a last resort. This is a backwards way of thinking.

You see when we pray we are speaking with the One who created the universe and everything in it. Does that add some weight to the word pray? How about this: when you pray, Jesus is interceding for you to the Father. What does that mean? It means that when you pray, Jesus prays. You see the Bible says that whatever you ask, in the name of Jesus, it shall be done.

So let's put an image to this that may be able to help you realize the magnitude of prayer. In a recent sermon I spoke about how prayer was taking a wrecking ball to the wall of troubles instead of using a ball point hammer, which I equated to all our own endeavors. This is a fantastic illustration. For all those in farming, think of it this way: your efforts are a shovel, your prayers are a plow. Now I know I don't know all that much about farming, but I know that trying to prepare one of your massive fields with a shovel, or even a hand tiller, sounds like a nightmare; while using a tractor to pull a plow sounds like a much more efficient method. But even these illustrations are not perfect. They simply display the magnitude of the power of prayer.

When we go before the Lord in prayer, we are approaching God in the same manner Abraham, Isaac,

Jacob, Moses, Noah, and Zachariah did. We are approaching the God of this universe and all of creation. We are approaching the great I AM! The one who set the Israelites free from Egypt, who called down plagues from heaven, who parted the waters at the Red Sea, who met every need of His chosen people for 40 years, and who loves you more than you can imagine! He will, He wants, He is waiting for you to approach Him so He can reach your needs!

I pray this month, March, will be a month where you MARCH to the Lord in prayer!

MinistrySafe Church Safety Training equips church staff members with awareness, tools and strategies to help protect children from sexual abuse in ministry contexts. This training is vital for full-time and bi-vocational pastors, executive pastors, student ministers, children's ministers and lay leaders.

MinistrySafe was created by attorneys who are sexual abuse experts. After decades of litigating sexual abuse cases, Gregory Love and Kimberlee Norris founded MinistrySafe to help ministries meet legal standards of care and reduce the risk of child sexual abuse. MinistrySafe provides preventative tools tailored to fit the needs of churches, camps, schools, youth sports, daycares and other children's programs.
