Pastor's column Christ-centered philosophy



"How we approach situations and events in our life is very telling as to what we hold in highest priority."

I have always loved that quote. It is absolutely correct. Often time, we go through our days reacting to different things, usually without realizing *how* we come to the reactions we come to. Some people call it instinct. Some would say it is your genetic

response. Both of those answers are popular, but both of them take away a very special gift that God bestowed upon mankind: free will.

If our reaction is simply based upon instinct, then we have reduced ourselves to the same 'primitive' creature as an animal. Instinct is defined as: an innate, typically fixed pattern of behavior in animals in response to certain stimuli. It basically means that given certain stimuli, you will respond the same way every time. And while we sometimes use the word *instinct* with such usage as a natural born hunter or sports player, we really do not mean the word in its actual usage.


The idea of a genetic response also removes free will, because it deduces all of our reactions down to a predetermined genetic response. And since science says that genetics will always respond in the same way, unless a mutation occurs, free will is null and void. Thus, the argument made by atheists is undone by their own work.

The way we respond to events in our life should not be done blindly. We should not simply *respond* without intention. When we embrace a Christcentered philosophy we begin to slow down and examine every situation in our life, and we realize that these situations are actually opportunities to show God's grace, mercy, hope, and love!

One of the ways we can begin to develop a more Christ-centered philosophy is to be more aware of our reactions and weigh them against the teachings in the Bible. We can also study the Bible more. On Sunday nights we just finished *Not A Fan*, and let me tell you: that study was fantastic. On March 19 we will begin *Weird: Because Normal Isn't Working*. It is all about developing a Christ-centered philosophy. I highly recommend coming, especially for the younger generation in the church. We will cover topics including: time management, money management, relationships, sex, and values. This is a great study that is beneficial to everyone: old, young, married, single.

I pray that you will join us and make Sunday Nights an amazing service. I promise that it will enrich your life. I promise that the extra time spent with God in His house is not time wasted and will not return void. I pray you will give this opportunity a try!

Backpack Buddies is a ministry where food insecure children receive food at school on Fridays which they take home so they will have something to eat over the weekend. Jeanie Brimm is heading this ministry for BBC as we are currently serving 15 kids at Dooly County Middle School. Jeanie and some of the youth are packing the items on Tuesday nights. Anyone who would like to help is welcome.

Jeanie will have a large container or tub in the connecting foyer beginning this Sunday where you can bring the food needed for this ministry. Food that the children can fix themselves is what is needed–no or little preparation. The goal is to provide 3 entrees, 2 breakfasts, 2 snacks, 1 juice per week, per child depending on funds and avaiability. Below is a list of suggested food to donate:

Entrees: Ravioli with meat sauce, spaghetti o's with meatballs, individually wrapped mac & cheese, vienna sausages, beef stew beas & franks, beef a roni, soup.

Breakfast items: Individually packaged cereal, pop tarts that require little or no cooking, cereal bars, granola bars, nutri grain bars, individual packs of grits and oatmeal.

Juice boxes

<u>Snacks</u>: Dried or canned fruits, fruit chews, peanut butter crackers, cheese crackers, goldfish, pudding or jello cups, mini microwave popcorn.


