Golden apples

A word spoken at the right time is like golden apples on a silver tray. Proverbs 25:11

Anyone can dish up compliments, especially if he's trying to get something in return for the praise. That's called flattery. Anyone can criticize under the pretense of "just being honest." That's called judging. But the truth spoken in love at the appropriate time takes wisdom. It's genuine, "like golden apples on a silver tray," and much more valuable.

The difference between these can be very subtle. For instance, your friend might come to you under deep conviction for his sin. You want to spare his feelings, so you try to convince him it's not a big deal. You're saying nice words, but you're not doing your friend any favors. Yes, he needs your kindness, but if the Holy Spirit is making him uncomfortable with his sin, you shouldn't try to make him comfortable with it.

On the other hand, you might speak the truth but say it with all the wrong motives. When a friend is suffering--even if it's because of her own choices--that's not the time to point out all the shortcomings that got her into her predicament. What she needs more than criticism is kindness. Don't use her vulnerability as a springboard to launch into sharing all her imperfections.

To be sure you use your words properly, always put your listener's best interests first. Be sensitive to what God wants to say through you, and you'll deliver a blessing to someone who really needs one. What all is involved in being someone who has the right word at the right time?




Judy and Lew now have three little girls!
