

Pastor's column **Truly thankful**



After searching the internet for the better part of my morning for a quote to spark an article for this month's *Blessings*, I finally found one. It comes from the brilliant mind of Jonathan Edwards. On the subject of being thankful in a way that most honors God Edward's said, "True gratitude or thankfulness to God for his kindness to us, arises from

a foundation laid before, of love to God for what he is in himself; whereas a natural gratitude has no such antecedent foundation. The gracious stirrings of grateful affection to God, for kindness received, always are from a stock of love already in the heart, established in the first place on other grounds, viz. God's own Excellency."

What I believe Edwards meant by this was, gratitude that is pleasing to God is not first a delight in the benefits God gives (though that is part of it). True gratitude must be rooted in something else that comes first. Namely, a delight in the beauty and excellence of God's character. Any other form of thankfulness is not God-honoring at all. To illustrate, I would invite each of you to put yourself in the position of giftgiver to me. You would not be honored if I thanked you often for your gifts to me but had no deep and natural regard for you as a person. You would feel insulted, no matter how much I thanked you for your gifts. If your character and personality did not give me joy in being around you, then you would just feel used, like a tool or a machine to produce the things I really love. The same is certainly true of God! If we are not captivated and/or held captive by His goodness, holiness and sovereignty then all our gratitude and thanksgivings are empty and vain.

Therefore, since Thanksgiving is almost upon us and Christmas is right around the corner, my challenge for all who read this fantastic publication (thank you Brenda) is to live a life of true thanksgiving; to be satisfied and worshipful with the character and goodness of God as your foundation and His amazing gifts second. This is the way we can show our church family and our community the Christ we so dearly love and serve; A Christ that is Lord of all; a Christ that is absolutely perfect yet He died like the vilest of criminals. We can show them a Savior whose existence is enough as opposed to some sort of "Celestial Santa Claus" that has come to just give us whatever our heart desires. The world has enough teaching like that!!

I look forward to putting this little mini-sermon to practice on November 22 in Groves Park as we have our first Community Thanksgiving Service. I pray God would be magnified and exalted in our little town for His glory and His glory alone! I will see you there.

Who's Missing?

Even after 2,000 years of Christian influence, more than 1.5 billion people are still missing out on the opportunity to hear the Gospel. They are hidden behind cultural, physical, political and language barriers to a Gospel witness. Many of the world's people missing from God's family live in concentrated pockets of lostness. The pockets we are focusing on in 2009 comprise:

- ◆About 40 nations and 700 languages
- ♦34 percent Muslim
- ◆32 percent Hindu
- ◆13.5 percent Animist
- ♦6 percent Buddhist
- ♦6 percent unknown religion
- ♦4 percent nonreligious/other

Although there is a small percentage of Christian, the rest are a mix of ancestor worshipper, shamanist, Jewish, Taoist and Sikhist. About 80 unreached people groups still have no contact with the outside world.

Whose Mission?

The Bible says the lost are living in darkness, alienated from God and without hope in the world. But our obedience will give them hope. God calls every church and every believer to be on mission with Him to break down the barriers. Learn the ways you can be on mission to help bring a lost people into God's family.

Prayer guides and offering envelopes will be available at the church house.
