## How to pack your shoebox gift

- 1. Get and wrap a shoebox and the lid with Christmas wrap OR pick up one of the preprinted boxes available at the bulletin board across from the nursery.
- 2. Select a quality "wow" toy such as a doll, soccer ball with pump, or stuffed animal to bless a child.
- 3. Pack full with other fun toy, hygiene items, and school supplies.
- 4. Most importantly, pray for the child who will receive your gift. Include a personal note and photo to delight the heart of the child.
- 5. Place a donation of \$9 per box to cover shipping and other project costs.
- 6. Place appropriate label (available at BBC or online) on box. Secure box with one to two rubber bands.

These backpacks filled with mostly books and food will be distributed to second graders in our Dooly school system for Christmas. We are sharing the love of Jesus by focusing on two major needs: childhood literacy and food insecurity. In 2019, 27 percent of Georgia third graders were reading below grade level. Two thirds of students who can't read well by end of fourth grade will likely end up in jail or on welfare. Having books at home to read will increase their chances to reach grade level in reading. Many kids in our county experience food insecurity.

### Guidelines for packing backpacks

- 1. Fill a <u>mesh</u> or <u>clear</u> backpack with books, food, school supplies, a few fun things (toys, candy, etc.)
- 2. Books should be on or below second grade reading level.
- 3. Single serving sized food that requires little or no preparation/cooking that a second grader could handle (i.e. fruit cups, cereal, juice, granola bars).
- 4. Bibles especially for children will be placed in all the backpacks so no need for you to pack one.
