

### Why MissionGeorgia offering?

Through Mission Georgia gifts, 1,170 Vacation Bible School leaders were trained to lead local churches in teaching 267,896 about Christ, with 8,794 decisions for Christ. With almost 9,000 boys and girls making decisions for Christ through the ministries of VBS this past year, Georgia State Missionaries were enabled to train equippers for \$35 each. History demonstrates that more equippers trained results in more children coming to faith in Christ.

760 leaders were trained in Sunday School Leadership through on-line training at the cost of \$5 per person. Strong Sunday Schools and Small Group Ministries in local churches result in more people coming to faith in Jesus. For every \$100 in Mission Georgia gifts, 20 leaders in churches that do not provide training can be equipped on-line by State Missionaries.

This past summer Camp Kaleo (Royal Ambassadors) had 4,933 campers participate at a Mission Georgia cost of \$17 per camper. 23 campers professed faith in Jesus Christ at Camp Kaleo this past year. After the winter storms in February, 2014, Disaster Relief teams responded to needs in the greater Augusta area. Your Mission Georgia offering helped provide 3,433 meals, complete 129 jobs, and share the Gospel 74 times, resulting in 4 professions of faith and 2 other decisions for Christ. Disaster Relief Teams trained by State Missionaries respond to crises not only in Georgia, but across our nation and as far away as the Philippines. In 2013, Disaster Relief trained 920 people in various locations for Disaster Relief, raising the total number of credentialed volunteers to 2,234. Since Hurricane Katrina in 2005, Southern Baptist Disaster Relief volunteers have averaged at least 1 profession of faith every 10 times the Gospel is presented during a disaster response.

Youth events (SuperWOW, MERGE, and MOVE) had 8,578 youth in attendance and 1,053 decisions to follow Christ at a Mission Georgia cost of \$15 per person.

Almost 9,000 teens participate in summer camps led by Georgia State Missionaries. For every \$125 in Mission Georgia gifts, a teen comes to faith in Jesus through this ministry.

Through the Mission Georgia Offering, \$2,000 per month is sent to help support agencies that minister to victims of human trafficking. Human Trafficking is a deplorable, but all too stark reality in today's world, and sadly, Atlanta is a hub for much of this activity. Your Mission Georgia gifts will enable the Georgia Baptist Convention to contribute almost \$25,000 dollars annually to ministries that are daily rescuing young men and women as well as teens and children, who are affected by this atrocity.

Over 3,500 non-English speaking Georgia residents (89 nations represented) were involved in reading classes through the efforts of Georgia State Missionaries last year. One in thirty who participated in these programs came to faith in Jesus as they were learning to read. Your Mission Georgia gifts provided the resources that led to 117 professions of faith.

Last year, 187,712 Georgia Baptists volunteered to go somewhere in the world for short-term mission work to share the good news of Jesus. Your Mission Georgia Offering supports State Missionaries who assist in coordinating these mission efforts.
